



## **Miss M.G. Mosley – 1920 (Edition 1)**

Miss M.G. Mosley was commended by assemblies at Kaitangata (Balclutha) and Moray Place, Dunedin, and went out to join Mr and Mrs Buchanan at Kamakerai, India in February 1920. She engaged in visitation with Indian women but owing to ill health had to return to New Zealand in 1924. Being sufficiently recuperated by 1930, she returned to India and helped out at Montauban, Ootacamund, caring for missionaries when they came up to the hills for a rest. She came home to New Zealand in 1936.

In 1949 Balclutha and Kaikorai assemblies commended her to the work of the Lord in India that she loved so much and she went out to help Miss Talbot at Ootacamund. She also helped at Coonor. In November 1955 she joined Mrs Webb at Rajahmundry and assisted in visiting and distributing literature. Her last few years in India were spent at Bangalore where again she was able to visit with Indian women helpers. She returned to New Zealand in 1960 and attended the assembly at Ellerslie. She died on May 7th, 1973, her last years having been characterised by prayer.
