



Miss M.G. Nicoll – 1931 (Edition 1)

Miss M. Gwen Nicoll was commended by Onehunga in fellowship with other Auckland assemblies and left for India in May 1931. She joined the Redwoods at Bangalore and assisted in the literary and printing work as well as encouraging the young people in the assemblies there. She found opportunities for service in teaching the Scriptures in the School and literature distribution with the young people. From 1935 onwards to 1940 her work in the school increased and she enjoyed the opportunities of helping young people in that medium. In 1940 she went to Coonoor to teach at the Hebron Girls' School for several years, later returning to New Zealand.
