late of the 1st Madras Fusiliers

Served in the Burmese War (1852-53) under General Godwin, Major Hill, Major Haweis, Capt Grant, Capt Tulloch, Capt Gosling, Capt Brown (Adjt.) One medal and clasp. Employed in suppressing an insurrection in the Bassein district under Major Haweis, Capt Grant, Capt Gosling. Served in the suppressions and rebellion in India in (1857) under Sir Henry Havelock's column from the 7th July 1857, present at the actions Futtehpoore, Aruing, [Aong] Poodiweskee [Poondinundee] Cawnpore from the 16th July, Bithoor. Served with Volunteer Cavalry from July to September. Crossed into Oude on the 19th September 1857. Present at Murragaawarra [Mungalwar], Oonao [Onao], Busceratgunge, [Busseerutgunge], Baboorchouckawanka. Entered into Lucknow under Sir Henry Havelock and Sir James Outram on the 25th Sept. 1857 and remained in its defence till relieved by Sir Colin Campbell (Commander-in-Chief). Served with Sir James Outram's division from 18th Nov 1857 until 15th March 1858. Present at the capture of Lucknow 1858. Served with Brigadier General Horsford in the north-western provinces of Oude. Crossed the river Goontee. Present at the action Sultanpore. Wounded on the 28th of August 1858 by a musket bullet on the left shoulder; bullet unextracted; under Surgeon Arthur 1st M. F.
