and this unfortunately prevented the gallant soldier from shewing his devotion to his British officer. (3rd class).

Subadar Abdoollah Khan, 3rd Punjab Infantry, on the same occasion, displayed undoubted gallantry by cutting down one of the enemy who jumped over the Sangar and attacked a sepoy of his detachment. Abdoollah Khan stepped forward to meet the man and after a short encounter killed him single handed and thus saved the sepoy's life. (3rd class).

After the retire had sounded during the attack on the Bezotee Afridis position on the 11th March 1868, Captn. P.C. Rynd ordered Jemadar Bissessur Misser to charge the enemy's breastwork before retiring. In this attempt which was, however, unsuccessful, the Jemadar shewed great coolness and decision; he went to the front at once and encouraged his men to the best of his ability, and on retiring alternatively down the hill, he was most active in placing the men in suitable positions and contributed materially to the safe withdrawal of the party. The Jemadar was as cool under the heavy fire of the enemy as if he were on the parade ground (3rd class).

SEPOY MRET BUZ, 3rd Punjab Cavalry, was personal orderly to Lieut and Adjutant C.K. McKinnon, on the 11th March 1868, and behaved with great coolness and courage in carrying Lieut. Mc Kinnon out of action when that officer was wounded a short distance from the enemy. (3rd class).

SEPOY ZURREEM KHAN, 6th Punjab Intantry, was among the party that advanced to support the 3rd Punjab Infantry in the attack on the enemy's position on the 11th March 1868, and endeavoured to scale the

flanking fire on the enemy. He was lost sight off for a time, but shortly afterwards was seen trying to help himself down the hill, badly wounded. He could not reach his party but managed to get far enough to be protected by their fire, and when brought down, it was found that he had received a bullet wound on his leg and a number of sword cuts on his person: proofs that he had been in actual contact, single-handed, with the enemy. (3rd class) (657 of 1868)

#### AGRORE N.W.F.-1868.

HAVILDAR NOOR AHMED. \ 2nd Punjab Infantry.

During the disturbances in Agrore on the N.W. Frontier, in 1868, Mr. Geo B. Scott, Sub assistant of the Revenue Survey, while out surveying, was attacked by an armed body of 150 of the enemy on Pogurmung near the Frontier of Ullaie on the 11th August 1868, and was gallantly defended by a guard of 17 men of the 2nd Punjab Infantry, led by Havildar Noor Ahmed and Naik Moshun Ali.

The guard displayed excellent self-reliance and a cool determined bravery in very trying circumstances. It acted entirely unsupported in a country where the people were openly hostile, and, without the orders and guidance of its own European officers, it threw up defences, held them, and though far outnumbered, repulsed the enemy and not only saved Mr. Scott, but every particle of his baggage, although harassed through a long night retreat of 20 miles in an unknown and most difficult country. (3rd class). (7 of 1869.)

NAIK BHUGUT SING of the same regiment, was promoted to the 2nd Class for conspicuous gallantry while in command of the rear picquet, and under a heavy fire of the enemy exposed himself to complete a breast-work, on the 23rd December 1871. (829 of 1872.)

### ANDAMAN ISLANDS.—1873.

PRIVATE MAHOMED MUCTOOM of the 27th Regiment of Madras Native Infantry, was granted the 3rd Class in consideration of his conspicuous gallantry in action with a party of Andaman Islanders on the 11th April 1873. (1277 of 1873).

#### JOWAKI EXPEDITION .- 1877.

The undermentioned Sepoys of the 5th Punjab Infantry, Punjab Frontier Force, were admitted to the 3rd class in consideration of their conspicuous gallantry

Lance Naik Sheea Sing, 29th (Punjab) Native Intantry, was admitted to the 3rd class for gallantry in action with the enemy at the capture of the Peiwar Kotal, on 2nd December 1878. (33. of 1879.)

KOT DAFADAR JHANDAH SING, 5th Punjab Cavalry, Punjab Frontier Force, was admitted to the 3rd Class for conspicuous gallantry in leading the charge of his troop against a force many times its number and under a heavy fire, in the fight against the Mangals on the 7th Jan. 1879 (106 of 1879.)

HAVILDAR DEWAH SING, 14th Regt. Native Infy (Ferozepore), was admitted to the 3rd Class in consideration of his conspicuous gallantry in action on the 21st Nov 1878 in the attack on Ali Masjid and in assisting Capt. J.G. Maclean, when wounded, out of a heavy fire.

HAVILDAR MAUN SING 14th Regt. (Ferozepore)

SEPOY HUSSAN KHAN, 24th (Punjab) Native Inty, was admitted to the 3rd Class for conspicuous gallantry on the 27th Jan 1879 in the Bazar Valley, in coming to the assistance of Lieut B. E. Spragge, 51st Regt. when suddenly attacked by a party of Afridis. (271. of 1879.)

RESSAIDAR SALIM KHAN, 1st Punjab Cavalry, was admitted to the 2nd Class for conspicuous gallantry in attacking an Afghan fanatic single-handed at Camp Kandahar, on the 6th Feb 1879. (299. of 1879.)

SECOND CLASS HOSPITAL ASSISTANT SHUNKUR DASS, attached to the 5th Gurkhas, was admitted to the 3rd Class of the Order for conspicuous gallautry on the 13th December 1878 when the Regt was attacked in the Supri defile. (365. of 1879.)
